

As part of our National Trail ride in Bryce Canyon on Friday May 28th we will ride a section of the Rim Trail followed by a potluck dinner. Dinner will be at 7:00 pm. Please RSVP Mike Huntsman 435-315-6557 or message me on Face book <https://www.facebook.com/UFTHBA/>.

We will be riding inside the park on Saturday May 29th. Because the park officials prefer we ride in small groups rather than a large one, those riders wanting to ride inside the park will make their own reservations with park official (Kevin 435-834-4736). There is a ride starting at 7:30 am, 12:30 pm, 4:30 pm, 5:00 pm and continuing each half hour until sunset. I would encourage you to call and schedule your ride as soon as possible.

In order to ride in the park a current Coggins, Health Certificate and Travel permit (Brand inspection for out of state horses) is required.

Most of us will be primitive camping during this trip. Our camp spot will be as follows:

Here are the directions to get there: From Highway 89 head east on highway 12 for about 10.5 miles. Turn right (South) on the Tropic Reservoir rd. (dirt road). Drive 13 miles on this road to the Kanab creek turn off. Turn right and drive 3/4 of a mile and turn right. Pull through the Green Metal gate and find a place to park/camp. There is kind of a loop road that you can see where many of the XP riders have camped. There is plenty of room for quite a few camps or trailers. The stream is a couple hundred yards away and there is plenty of water in it for the horses.

Ruby's Inn has accommodations and stall rentals for those preferring not to primitive camp. However, participants will need to trailer to the primitive camping site to join up with the group.
